III. EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATION / COMMITTEE DISCUSSION

A. Introductions

Mr. Houle welcomed everyone to the Committee and introductions were made.

B. Icebreaker

Mr. Houle introduced a book he had read, Work Happy by Jill Geisler. He then led the attendees in an activity that talked about five key leadership qualities and encouraged everyone to think about their own leadership style and how they might be more effective.

C. Finance 101: An Overview of School Budgets

Mr. Presnal made a presentation to the attendees on School Finance facts his information included: Municipal vs. Regional District and their funding sources; the Governance that oversees school finance; financial structure of the District; reporting requirements; funding sources and Chapter 70 Funding. Mr. Presnal was unable to finish but will send Ms. McLaughlin the slides and she will make them available to the attendees.

D. Technology Update: 1:1 Initiative – schedule and implementation Superintendent Willard and Mr. Presnal reported on the status of the technology 1:1 initiative. Ms. Willard reminded the Committee that 19/20 is the first year in a four year plan and implementation will be staggered and deliberate.

In 19/20 the focus will be on providing 1:1 devices for 7th and 8th grade students and training for teachers. These devices will not go home will students, but will be assigned to them and used throughout the day. Powder Mill Grade 5 and 6 teachers will receive laptops and training in preparation for student rollout in 20/21 as well as new COWs and wireless projectors. A COW is a Computer On Wheels and is a cart with enough laptops for one classroom. Woodland School will receive laptops and iPads to pilot in their classrooms to more accurately identify the true needs and use of teachers and students. In the following years, the District will consistently evaluate and make adjustments to the rollout plan as needed.

Ms. Petschke asked about the devices and the training. Mr. Presnal explained that they will be a Microsoft Compatible web based device similar to the chrome book and they will be leased on a four year cycle. Mr. Turmel explained that Mr. Taglieri is scheduled to meet regularly with 7th and 8th grade teachers to train and support implementation in their classrooms.

Ms. Boldyga asked if there is a way to make the same devices available for parents to purchase for use at home. Mr. Presnal will reach out to the vendor to see if that is a possibility.

The Committee also asked if Mr. Taglieri can present at an upcoming School Committee meeting to present Office 365 and how it can be used to augment teaching as well as a tool that the Committee members have access to.

Mr. Presnal reviewed the immediate timeline for deployment of devices for 7th and 8th grade, with an estimated student roll-out at the end of September.

E. Review Survey Results: Student, Parent, Teacher and School Committee
Ms. Willard reviewed the results of the end of year survey conducted by the District. She highlighted that the
participation rate was very low – 22 parents, 248 students, 70 staff members – and that more data is needed for
accurate information. The District will look at ways to more effectively reach respondents.

Ms. Willard reported on key findings based on data received and some of the things the District is doing to respond:

- Students are motivated to come to school by social interactions: with friends, through clubs, sports and leadership opportunities. The District is also working with teachers to be sure they are making connections with individual students and being mindful of their own impact.
- Diversity will become more of a topic in the near future. Ongoing training for staff and students alike
- Parents are looking for more information about what is happening in the classroom, with the absence of so much homework: the math departments will send out newsletters before each unit, resources for math practice at home will be provided to families
- Teacher supports will be increased with coaching cycles, and there will be common math assessments after each unit

Mr. Houle reviewed the survey that Committee members took and the action items that will take place. Overall the Committee feels that the District and the Committee are working well together and goals are aligned. Areas of improvement continue to be communication and policies.

- F. Programmatic "Wish-List" Discussion: Principals present their "wish-lists"
 - Erin Fahey Carrier Powder Mill School
 - 1. Large format printer to create exciting and inspiring visuals
 - 2. Interventions: individualized curriculum requires purchases
 - 3. Alternative furniture for classrooms, seating, standing desks, rocker seats, etc
 - 4. One more paraprofessional assigned to building so that there are three at each grade level.

Kimberley Saso – Woodland School

- 1. Alternative furniture and sensory tools in classrooms.
- 2. Library solution that addresses the changes with technology.
- 3. Social emotional supports for students more counselors
- 4. Playground evaluation of equipment and grounds around playground
- 5. Sidewalks in front of school are deteriorating
- 6. HVAC system evaluation, current systems are struggling
- 7. Gymnasium sound absorption, currently two classes at a time and very difficult to manage

Joseph Turmel - Southwick Regional School

- 1. Technology Educations program of studies review
- 2. Athletic Facilities sports participation is expanding, possible add lacrosse
- 3. School Hallway would like to update the doors to older part of the building so they have the magnetic sensors that new doors have.
- 4. Main Entrance to have handicap accessible opener
- 5. More Professional Development with 1:1 implementation

Noell Somers - Special Education

1. Instruction Coach: Co-teaching. Would like to add a position for someone who can work with the Special Education and the Classroom Teacher to bridge the two and enhance the co-teaching inclusive model.

Educational Focus for 19/20

Math Initiative – Jenny Sullivan, Director of Curriculum and Instruction

Ms. Sullivan gave the Committee a presentation of the Math Journey that the District has been on. She spoke of the history of education and how it is shifting from an industrial to post-industrial model and how the District needs to also shift to meet the changing needs of students for college and career in the 21st century. She reviewed the Mount Holyoke Math training and talked about the shifts taking place in STGRSD classrooms. She asked for the Committees support, respect of the time frame and communication with communities. She stated that the teachers need some time to develop their craft which is unlike how they themselves learned. She also mentioned that there will be an implementation dip as the teachers and students work through this new process.

At 2:50 p.m. Mr. Houle released the Principals, Ms. Somers and Ms. Sullivan and thanked them for their participation in the day.
