Your child has displayed possible symptoms of COVID-19 while on school bus or in the school building...

Current Massachusetts DPH guidance is that all symptomatic individuals in Massachusetts should be tested. An individual who does not wish to be tested may return to school on day 6 from start of symptoms, as long as their symptoms have improved and they have been without fever for at least 24 hours prior to their return to school without the use of fever reducing medication.

Testing options may be a PCR or antigen test for Covid-19. An antigen test may be self-administered and does not need to be proctored or performed by a healthcare professional.

Proceed as follows according to test results:

- IF Covid-19 test is NEGATIVE: Students may return to school after they have tested negative for COVID-19, have improvement in symptoms, and have been without fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications (i.e. Acetaminophen (Tylenol) or Ibuprofen (Motrin)).
- If a provider makes an alternative diagnosis for the COVID-19-like symptoms, the individual may return to school based on the recommendations for that alternative definitive diagnosis (e.g., influenza or strep pharyngitis) provided written documentation is submitted to the school nurse by the licensed medical provider. Verbal communication, or written statements by parents/guardians will not be accepted.
- IF POSITIVE: Student remains at home (except to get medical care), monitor their symptoms, notify the school, notify personal close contacts, and assist the school in contact tracing efforts. Isolate at home for at least 5 days, return to school/sports/activities on day 6 or later when fever free for at least 24 hrs and other symptoms are significantly improved and must wear a mask at all times when around others for an additional 5 days. They can only remove mask when actively eating or drinking.
